### NAPLAN 2017

Students in year 3, 5 and 7 have been involved in the annual NAPLAN testing this week.

#### General Information

NAPLAN test are administered simultaneously in all schools across Australia. The aspects of literacy assessed are reading, writing and language conventions (comprising spelling, punctuation and grammar).

The aspects of numeracy assessed are number, algebra, function and pattern, measurement, chance and data and space.

NAPLAN individual student reports are distributed in September.

Friday May 12th – catch up day

Any student who missed a test due to illness or other reasons had an opportunity to complete it on the catch up day (Friday May 13<sup>th</sup>).

Greg seems to have adjusted well to the life of a retiree and is currently sailing the Pacific somewhere off Queensland.

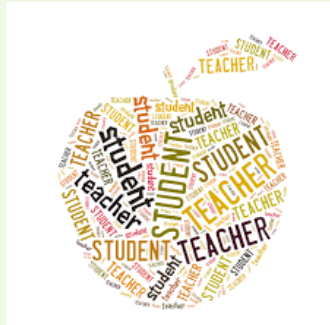


## Pre-Service Students

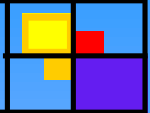
We also welcome Ayla, a second year student from Flinders University who is completing a Literacy placement in Room 0.

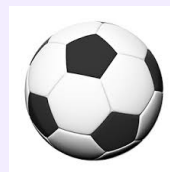

We wish all of our teams the best of luck.

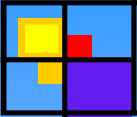
